

Troop Fundraising Chair Volunteer Ministry Description

Purpose: Support the mission of AHG to build women of integrity by organizing and implementing fundraisers to keep Troop costs to a minimum, making AHG affordable for families.

Reports To: Troop Coordinator

Responsibilities:

General:

- Pray for the Charter Organization, the Troop's Adult and Girl Members, and the AHG Ministry.
- Model spiritual leadership by intentionally including prayer and Scripture into all that the Troop does.
- Adhere to AHG Health and Safety Policies and Guidelines.
- Attend regular Troop meetings, activities, and events.
- Coordinate with Troop Ministry Team to promote AHG in the local community.
- Set the expectation for uniforms and model correct uniform at all AHG Meetings, events, and activities.

Role Specific:

- Partner with the Charter Organization and Troop Board to set fundraising goals and select a maximum of three fundraisers.
- Communicate with the Charter Organization for fundraiser approval.
- Utilize AHG's finance and fundraising resources to develop fundraising best practices for the Troop.
- Vision cast to families and girls about fundraising to build engagement and excitement.
- Track and organize fundraising details including sales and progress toward fundraising goals.
- Work with the Troop Treasurer to collect fundraising monies.
- Report fundraiser results to the Charter Organization and Troop Board.

Qualifications:

- Registered AHG Adult Member, at least 21 years old.
- Maintain your personal relationship with Jesus Christ and be an effective witness for Him.
- Active and regular participation in a local church, small group, and/or similar gathering to grow in your relationship with Jesus Christ and fellowship with other believers.
- A positive, Christ-like attitude with a passion for growing the AHG Ministry.
- Serve as an example and live by the AHG Oath, Creed, Mission, and Statement of Faith.
- Commitment to teamwork and Biblical conflict resolution.
- Has experience stewarding money with excellence.
- Preferred strengths: humility, communication, organization, detail oriented.
